


- The plan is for Clam Shell of K Structures to be built.

Duty Hours

Executive Safety Board

- MCO 5100.2 states work up to 84 hours but must be documented and approved.
 - TSS must develop a daily work plan and have it reviewed and approved by the first O-6 in the COC and then sent and approved by the comptroller in the rear.
- II MEF MSG Guidance for Overtime (OT) pay of deployed civilian personnel (**DTG 261608Z OCT 09**)
 - TSS authorized 7/8 with all over time preapproved or if after the fact strong justification must be documented.



SECNAVINST 7000.11C

Executive Safety Board

- Subj: Civilian Overtime and Compensatory Time Administration
- Para 5 Policy. The following policies are established to control overtime and compensatory time usage and minimize personnel costs
 - A. Overtime and compensatory time shall be limited to cases of necessity, such as:
 - (1) Urgent fleet readiness
 - (2) Emergencies
 - (3) Safeguarding life and property
 - (4) Individual incidences where savings can be clearly demonstrated, or
 - (5) Where the commanding officer can demonstrate that the overtime or compensatory time work cannot be accomplished during normal working hours.



OVERTIME continued

Executive Safety Board

- (5) Where the commanding Officer can demonstrate that the overtime or compensatory time work cannot be accomplished during normal working hours.
- b. Offices and commands shall attempt to minimize the cost impact associated with scheduling work and maintaining priorities at field activities, particularly as it pertains to changes in existing schedules and reassignment of priorities.
- c. The approval of overtime or compensatory time shall be vested in the commander or commanding officer or, as delegated in writing, to at least one organizational level above the level ordering the use of the overtime or compensatory time.



OVERTIME Continued

Executive Safety Board

- E. Based upon effectiveness in meeting schedules and when resulting in overtime savings, consideration should be given to:
 - (1) Utilization of part-time and intermittent employees, and a full-time employee in temporary positions
 - (2) Contract work, if not in conflict with generally accepted practices of government employment
 - (3) Maximum use of shift work.

- 0700-0930: Monday - Sunday
 - Check incoming mishap Flash Reports
 - Record mishaps in log
 - Prepare & Distribute Safety Alerts and Msg to units on unsafe equipment & conditions
- 0930-1200
 - Make WESS- DS entries



Average Week Continued

Executive Safety Board

- 1200-1230 – Lunch
- 1230 -1530 Camp Inspection
 - Required daily due to throughput of units
 - Time will increase with growth of Camp
- 1600-1700 Inspect Camp Burn Pit
 - Check for illegal dumping/burning
- 1730 -1800 – Evening Meal
- 1800-1900 – Review Blotter and Binnacle Reports



Average Week Continued

Executive Safety Board

- Other Requirements
 - Teach R&R Safety Classes upon request
 - Teach Gator Classes upon request
 - Teach heater Safety upon request
 - Teach Electrical Safety upon request
 - Teach Fire Safety upon request
 - Assist all unit safety officers with technical advice, provide guidance and recommendation and follow-up.
